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1. Action Plan

1.1. Purpose of the Action Plan

Casey's Affordable Housing Strategy (the Strategy) articulates Council's vision for all Casey residents to have access to secure, appropriate, and affordable housing. The Strategy guides how to accomplish this vision through strategic principles. Once adopted by Council, the Strategy will be informed by this Action Plan for the implementation of the strategic principles for the advocacy, partnering, and facilitation of affordable housing in Casey.

1.2. Implementation of Strategic Principles

This section outlines the actions to implement the strategic principles and respond to the objectives identified by the strategic principles in this Strategy. Actions are proposed to be delivered within the following timeframes:

- » Ongoing
- » Short 1 year
- » Medium 2-3 years
- » Long 4+ years
