Excerpt of respondent comments: -



"It's hard enough...even with a good wage coming in"

"We have noticed the increase of

homeless people around the area and believe more should be done to assist these people"

"Some families are struggling to afford rental housing"

"More social housing is needed across Victoria. Would be better closer to city as more services and jobs"

"Rent is way too pricey for me as a single parent"

"Expenses are increasing. It interest rates go up definitely we will be in trouble"

"There is not enough options. It's just me and my husband but we cannot find a 1-2 bedroom place so we are renting..I want to stay in Casey but...might be forced to go somewhere else"



"I don't believe ratepayers money

should be used to assist in the supply of affordable housing as it is a federal or state govt. responsibility... taxed too much as it is...that's where the focus should be"

"I think housing affordability is reasonable within the City of Casey at the moment. Both rental and purchase prices seem reasonable"

"might increase unnecessary living stress... like Dandenong. All major crime, burglary in there due to all recent refugees"

"Social housing residents don't keep living standards...do not have lawns maintained, trash stockpiled...bogan attitudes...depreciates the value of neighbouring properties"

"I don't know if its a problem or not"

"I don't believe it is...council's responsibility to provide affordable housing but do believe they can assist in helping to find more affordable housing"
